## Warning! Facebook Does NOT have a “Dislike” Button

There’s a new Facebook scam making the rounds and it’s taking advantage of a non-existent Facebook feature many users crave: the “Dislike” button. This scam falsely claims to offer such a button and spreads in the form of links that appear to be from friends.

If you see Facebook status update containing the message, “I just got the Dislike button, so now I can dislike all your dumb posts lol!” or “ Get the official DISLIKE button now” followed by a link, you should know that it’s just another one of many scams designated to extract personal data. It tries to trick you into completing a survey, thereby gaining access to your profile and the ability to spam your friends.

Again, there is currently no official Facebook “Dislike” button– just the “Like” button. The scam is a good reminder not to click on suspicious links on Facebook, especially if they promise something that sounds unlikely or impossible. If you have fallen for the scam, remove offending app(s) from your Facebook profile and remove the related message from your status, News Feed, and Likes and Interests.
