NEW WEBMAIL LOOK

The Week of April 7th, ATC will be implementing a new Webmail look. This new look is possible due to a mail server upgrade. Webmail is accessible through our website www.atcjet.net.

This change will give our customers a new secure technology with new features. With the new Webmail, you will have a better E-mail presence and IM access. In the future, if you find yourself wanting to change your email address due to a lot of SPAM and Junk e-mail, ATC will be able to change your e-mail address without you losing your old e-mails. This will also allow ATC to open up some of the controls we currently have on Webmail, such as not being able to send to more than 5 contacts at a time and not being able to send more than 20 e-mails a day.

Through the new Webmail, we will be able to offer Suite Packages to our residential and business customers that include special features, such as Calendaring, Tasks, Remote POP, Additional Storage Space, SIP, offsite secure backup, and other useful applications. We hope to have this information out to our customers in the May Newsletter.

With this new technology, future advances such as Internet phone and blog pages will be possible and easy to implement.

This would also be a great time to do some spring cleaning of your mail inboxes. With this new upgrade we will be requiring that each web storage email account be less than 100 MB. When we implement this new service, if your mail inbox is greater than 100 MB you will not receive emails. The limit of 100 MB also includes emails in your other personal folders including trash. Once your mail inbox is below 100 MB you will receive emails normally. Using an email application, such as Outlook Express or Mozilla Thunderbird has the ability to keep emails on ATC's server. This is possible through IMAP or a setting in the email application. To check if emails are being left on ATC's server, please go to www.atcjet.net and scroll down to Webmail. Enter your email address (username@atcjet.net) and password. This will take you into Webmail. We will be contacting customers by phone who are over the 100 Meg limit.

If you know of an email account that you currently do not use, please feel free to give us a call and we can close that account for you.

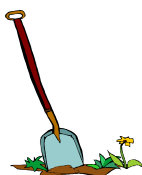

WEATHERING STORM OUTAGES

Here are a few suggestions on things to check if you should lose your telephone or computer service after a storm. Power outages caused by lightning seem to be the main problem, causing cordless phones, answering machines, modems and routers to malfunction. Satellite receivers with pay per view modems can also lock up a phone line after an outage. If you experience outages after a storm, try unplugging these items from the power source and the phone jack, if necessary. After everything is disconnected, reconnect them one by one to see if power is restored.

DID YOU KNOW

Federal law mandates that February 17, **2009** is the last day of full-power analog television broadcasting

1. **YOU DO NOT HAVE TO THROW YOUR OLD TELEVISIONS AWAY.**
2. As long as you are being provided service through a cable or satellite TV subscription your service should not be affected by the February 17, **2009** cut-off date, regardless of whether you have an older analog television or a newer high definition tv.
3. If you have an older TV and receive your signal from an antenna you can purchase a digital-to-analog converter box. Every U.S. household is eligible to receive up to two coupons, worth \$40.00 each, toward the purchase of an eligible digital-to-analog converter box.
