



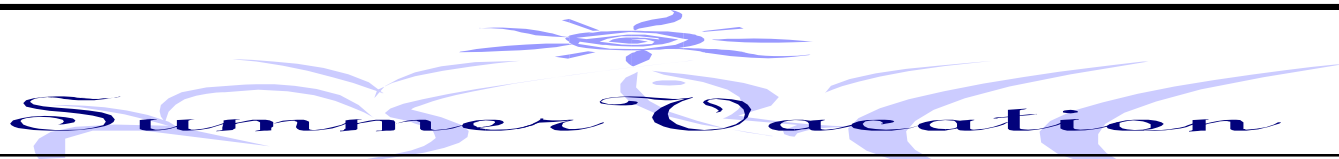

### Nebraska Telephone Assistance Program “(NTAP)”

In compliance with the Telecommunications Act of 1996 low income subscribers may qualify to receive reduced installation charges and reduced monthly charges for basic telephone service.

The “NTAP” program provides reduced connection charges to eligible telephone company subscribers. This reduction is 50% of connection charges or \$30.00, whichever is less. There is also deferred payment of connection charges without interest and customers who voluntarily participate in toll blocking may have deposits waived. The “NTAP” program provides reduced monthly charges to eligible telephone company subscribers. The reduced amount will be a credit of \$13.50 each month on basic telephone service. This credit applies only to the main line listed in the name of the eligible subscriber.

Eligibility for the NTAP program is determined by a subscriber’s participation in one of the following programs: Medicaid, Food Stamps, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Federal Housing Assistance, Low Income Home Energy Assistance. If you qualify for any of these programs and wish to apply for the NTAP program contact the agency administering the program in which you participate for an application. ## SPAM FILTERING/EMAIL PROTECTION

ATC Communications is offering a spam filtering, email protection service for our internet customers. This service will help prevent unwanted messages from reaching your email inbox. This service will allow you to be in charge of spam filtering for your own email account. Your email protection service filters all incoming email for junk and virus-infected messages, before they reach your inbox. Legitimate messages are delivered to your inbox as usual, but unwanted and potentially harmful messages are diverted and quarantined in a message center. The message center is located at ATC's secure email data center. You can access the message center at [www.atcjet.net](http://www.atcjet.net) to review and retrieve quarantined messages by logging in from any standard Web browser. You will be responsible for setting up and maintaining the service in a way that works best for you. As always, we are here to help and answer any questions that you may have about the service.

## DO-NOT-CALL NOTIFICATION

The Federal Communication Commission (FCC) and Federal Trade Commission (FTC) are now sharing responsibility for enforcing the National Do-Not-Call list. The FCC now requires all telecommunications carriers that provide Local Exchange Service to notify their subscribers of their rights as they relate to the Do-Not-Call rules. You have the right to give or revoke an objection to receiving telephone solicitations. To register or revoke your registration, please call 1-888-382-1222 (TTY 1-866-290-4236) or via the Internet at [www.donotcall.gov](http://www.donotcall.gov).

The national registry prevents telephone solicitations made for commercial purposes only, and will not prevent telephone solicitations made by a tax-exempt nonprofit organization, for example, for charitable or political purposes. Also, the registry will not prevent calls from companies with whom you may have an established business relationship.

The FCC has defined an established business relationship as one in which the consumer has "a prior or existing relationship" with a company that is formed voluntarily through communications between the company and the consumer on the basis of a purchase or transaction regarding products or services within eighteen (18) months immediately preceding a telephone solicitation, and which has not been previously terminated by either the consumer or the company. Such an established business relationship also exists on the basis of a consumer inquiry regarding a company's products or services within three (3) months immediately preceding the date of a telephone solicitation and which has not been previously terminated by either the consumer or the company.
